Stations:

1. **The Thankful Tree** - Students will write, on a leaf cut-out, one thing they are thankful for. After hanging the leaf, they can take a cup of apple cider or juice.

2. **Caramel Apples** - A make-your-own station with a crockpot of caramel, sliced apples, and food items to sprinkle on top. To stay nut-free, take just the apple.

3. **Thank You in Every Language** - Chrome Books will be set up with Google Translate so children can learn how to say thank you in the language associated with their nationality. They will also add their country of origin data to a large graph to be displayed in the lobby showing where we all originated.

4. **Bridge Building STEM** - Materials will be set up for children to creatively build and test a bridge that will sustain the weight of a toy car. They will label the 2 sides of the bridge with stickers that say, Stony Hill and People in Need.

5. **C.A.R.E.S. Crafts** - To show they care, students will design placemats using construction paper, stencils, and stickers to convey positive messages. This craft will be given to the soup kitchen to use at Thanksgiving dinner. Students can also make a take-home holiday banner.

6. **A Charlie Brown Thanksgiving** - The video will be shown in a classroom set up with blankets on the floor.

7. **Coffee and water** will be provided. Families can feel free to bring their own snacks to eat at cafeteria tables.

8. **The Play Scape** is available for parent-supervised use, weather permitting.
