

KISD Proactive Drug Testing Procedures
Frequently Asked Questions:

<u>QUESTIONS</u>	<u>ANSWERS</u>
<p>Q: Pertaining to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Offense is that per calendar year-per offense or does it roll over each year?</p>	<p>A: Consequences of positive test results are cumulative throughout the student's enrollment in the District.</p>
<p>Q: What is the possibility of problems for our kids if we know that some drugs can stay in your system longer than others? Could it cause some kids to fail two drugs tests in a row?</p>	<p>A: There is 25-day turn around for testing—so there is a low risk of repeat drug testing causing a test failure.</p>
<p>Q: What if a student ID number/name is called and they are not at school? How are students pulled out of class?</p>	<p>A: The 3rd party company will contact one person in district, the night before the testing is to occur. The campus administrator will receive names of students to be tested that morning and will go and collect the students for that screening. If a student is absent students will be tested the next random screening.</p>

<p>Q: How many students will be tested each time?</p>	<p>A: We will test between 3%-10% of eligible students.</p>
<p>Q: If they test positive will they have to test again?</p>	<p>A: Yes, any student receiving a positive test result will be required to participate in each random test for a calendar year.</p>
<p>Q: If they test negative can they be tested again?</p>	<p>A: Yes, student's name go into the testing pool each time and can be pulled again through random selection. Therefore, it is possible for a student's name to be pulled more than once.</p>
<p>Q: What is involved in the long term plan for the student to receive help and stay off of drugs?</p>	<p>A: That's exactly the heart of our program. KISD is partnering with community organizations like Wellness Point, ETCADA, and CDFY to help meet the needs of the student and the family. One of the things we are trying to do is find out where the problem is in the student's environment based on the student's needs. Every plan is tailored to the student and family's need. Plans could include professional screening, educational classes, or counseling services.</p>
<p>Q: What happens if the student/family refuses the required support</p>	<p>A: Then the student cannot return to extracurriculars and</p>

plan?	parking on campus
Q: What if a student continues to refuse testing?	A: If a student refuses to test it counts as a positive test result and follows the consequences as outlined in FNF (Local).
Q: Do students know immediately if they pass or fail the drug screen?	A: No it takes several days before KISD receives results from the 3 rd Party drug testing laboratory.
Q: Is there any medication form for parents to fill out for students who are medications?	A: Following a positive test result, parents will have two days to provide documentation of any medications that the student was prescribed by a doctor and taking as prescribed to KISD.
Q: How does the company get the list of students?	A: They get the entire pool of available students who are participating in extracurricular and/or parking on campus and who have signed consent forms for random drug testing.

<p>Q: Can a KISD employee or KISD administrator send a student's name be "put in" or "suggested" if a student is "suspected" of using drugs?</p>	<p>A: No, the program is a random drug screening measure and names will not be submitted by our staff. The only names of students that will be automatically tested each screening will be those that had positive drug tests on previous screenings.</p>
<p>Q: If my child is not currently participating in an extracurricular activity, can I still sign a permission form and have my student participate in random drug testing?</p>	<p>A: Yes, parents can submit the consent for drug testing form even if their child is not yet participating in an extracurricular activity. If parents do submit the form, though, the parent and child must abide by all of the drug testing guidelines.</p>
