### **BART Announces Upcoming Enrollment Deadline**

Adams, MA – The Berkshire Arts and Technology (BART) Charter Public School is currently accepting enrollment applications for students in grades 6 -10 for the 2019-2020 school year. Applications are available online or you can request one be mailed to you.

If your child can enroll in a district public school, then your child can enroll at BART. Families interested in enrolling their student should:

- Submit an enrollment application form by email, post, or by fax.

Important Enrollment Dates:

- The *first* enrollment deadline for the **2019-20** school year for grades 6 - 10 is Thursday, January 17, 2019, at 12:00 p.m.
- The *last* enrollment deadline to transfer in the current **2018-19** school year for grades 6 - 9 is Thursday, February 14, 2019.

Enrollment applicants are accepted provided there is a vacant seat in the grade for which the student is applying. If there are no open seats, a lottery is held at Adams Town Hall at 2 p.m. on the deadline to determine placement on a waitlist.
