

## Pacifica High School - Career & Technical Education Pathways

Pacifica High School offers students the opportunity to complete a program of study in a field of interest. Four sectors are available: Digital Media, Business, Engineering, and Computer Science. Students who complete at least 10 credits in a “Concentrator” level course, followed by a “Capstone” course in the same pathway, earn a CTE Pathway Completion certificate that indicate college and career readiness.
