

September 6, 2018

The Oneida Special School District Board of Education met in regular session on Thursday, September 6, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. in the Oneida High School Library. The following members were present: Dr. Danny Cross, Mrs. Dorothy Watson, Mrs. Sandy Martin, Mr. Jason Perry and Dr. Nancy Williamson. Also in attendance were Director Jeanny Hatfield, Student Representative Christian Blakley and Lori Marcum, Secretary.

Chairperson Williamson recognized Mrs. Scarlett Ellis to swear in the newly elected board members. Sworn in were Mrs. Sandy Martin, Mr. Jason Perry and Mrs. Dorothy Watson.

Chairperson Williamson called the meeting to order. Jaycee Perry led those in attendance in the pledge of allegiance.

Health Services

- The Scott County Health Department will be offering Influenza vaccinations to all of our students in October. Permission notes for these students vaccinations will go out the first week in September.
- School Health screenings will be September 21st for Oneida High and Oneida Middle Schools. Screenings for Oneida Elementary will be September 28th. A special thanks to Dr. Danny Chako's, Dr. Nyla Cross and Dr. Faire's offices for administering free dental screens for students.
- Asthma and Allergy of Knoxville will be administering free pulmonary function testing to all 4th and 7th grades doing health screens. Students must return the consent form to receive this service on September 21st and September 28th.

Physical Activity and Staff Wellness

- Coordinated School Health, Fuel Up to Play and The National Dairy Council has joined forces to increase physical activity and nutrition resource through a Fuel Up to Play 60 grant funding. Coordinated School Health Coordinator obtained near \$12,000.00 in grant funding for this program. The physical activity play for this program will include walk and run clubs! The FUTP 60 KICK OFF will be September 18th at each school building from 1:30- 3:00 p.m.
- Staff wellness initiatives are gearing up! Oneida Middle School will receive a treadmill and bike for their newly established physical activity room. Coordinated School Health will be providing monthly incentives for both all staff physical activity rooms for the month of September!

Nutrition News!

- The new **Smart Mouth Pizza** and Grab N Go Meals were served this month and both are “big hit” with students! Lunch participation has increased this year but second chance breakfast has ALSO increased participation by 70 students and overall 4%! New breakfast options coming up in September will include: smoothies, other breakfast drinks and a yogurt bar! Thank you, Ms. Cathy Buttram!

School Safety and Security

- SAVE Act Coordinator, Ms. McCartt completed the grant application for safety and security funding. Funding was awarded to the Oneida School District in the amount of: \$53,160.00. The funding will be used to purchase: Limited Access Control, key card entry system, walkthrough metal detectors, window glazing, security guards and cameras. Morning back pack searches and metal detection wandering are currently being implemented efficiently each morning from 7:30 a.m. - 8:20 a.m.

Oneida Schools’ Family Resource

- Family Resource and STAND have partnered to provide the Angel Tree program SIX WISHES. This program will provide 50 needy students in our school district who will need support during Christmas Holidays. The program will provide: 3 toys, clothing and shoes for each needy child.
- The Oneida Schools Family Resource Center provided food, clothing, school supplies, and shoes for 152 students. The Oneida School’s Family Resource Center provided 7 parents with Cooperative and Active parenting classes this month as well. The Family Resource Director has written a grant for funding parenting classes that will include school success, trauma and chronic absenteeism. This parenting class program will begin no later than October 2018 when the Family Resource begins working with Tier 2 student absenteeism families.
