ABSENCE OF STUDENTS

Parents are asked to call the school office (419-447-1566) by 8:30 AM if your child will be absent. Please leave a detailed message of your child's illness, including teachers name, if we are unable to answer the phone. We are required by law to have communication with parents in the event of an absence. Any student arriving after 8:15 will be considered tardy. A parent note or phone call of explanation is required. Parents are also to sign their children in at the office upon arrival. If your child will be ordering a school lunch, this must be requested by 8:30AM.

TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT NEWS RELEASE

The Ohio Revised Code requires that all school bus drivers assign each student a designated place of safety on the residence side of the roadway on which the vehicle is scheduled to stop. The bus driver must account for each pupil at designated place of safety before leaving. Pupils are not to proceed to their residence until the school bus has departed.

Parents, please ask your student to show you their designated place of safety and reaffirm with them how important it is that they remain until the school bus has departed. If you are picking your student up from a bus stop, please remain at the designated place of safety with them.

I would like to remind all motorists to please obey the flashing red lights on a stopped school bus, this means STOP your automobile for the safety of the students. Since the first of the school year, a few vehicles have passed stopped school buses while picking up or discharging students. Remember that on a one-way street, traffic in both lanes must STOP.

Parents please take a minute to speak to your child about proper behavior on the school bus. We continue to have a lot of standing and changing seats while the bus is moving, a passenger in a school bus is only properly protected when seated facing forward with their feet on the floor. -Submitted by: Randy Conger, Transportation Supervisor.
