## Before entering 5<sup>th</sup> grade you MUST have mastered the following skills:

#### Language Arts- These skills must be mastered by August 2018.

- Write complete sentences with correct punctuation and capital letters
- Know the basic parts of speech: nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives
- Know the writing process-all six steps
- Be able to answer questions in YOUR OWN WORDS by restating the question and answering with details.
- Differentiate between main idea and details in a given passage
- Be able to read and write in cursive fluently
- Be able to recognize the difference between sentences, fragments, and run-ons.

#### Math- These skills must be mastered by August 2018.

- Know multiplication facts 1-12 in three seconds or less
- Know addition/subtraction facts up to/ from 20
- Know basic fractions such as ½, 1/3, ¼
- Know basic math vocabulary such as sum, product, numerator, etc.
- Know long division process
- Know 2 digit or greater multiplication process
- Know difference between factors and multiples
- Know place value from billions to thousandths
- Know how to use a ruler and know basic measurement skills
