Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2016-17 educational progress for the Dieck Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN ONE OF THESE LABELS.

We continue to focus on the needs of individual students. Our quarterly assessments, Student Data Meetings; and the subsequent assistance provided to our students through our Multi-tiered System of Support, continues to provide targeted assistance to students that are experiencing specific challenges in meeting academic success. Students that are assigned to particular support interventions protocols have their progress monitored on a bi-weekly schedule.

This practice provides us with data by which we can evaluate the impact of each intervention on a student's growth, and to make adjustments to instruction as required. Our designation as a Title I school, gives us additional resources to with which to enhance the academic engagement of our students.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. Student building assignment is based on residency or by participating in the School of Choice process for this year and the previous years.
2. Our SIP (School Improvement Plan) has annual reviews each year and revisions by each school and also by the district, which are implemented as soon as possible.

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3. Swartz Creek Community Schools does not have any specialized schools.
4. The Swartz Creek School District follows the Michigan Merit Curriculum using High School and Grade Level Content Expectations to guide classroom instruction. Michigan recently adopted the National Common Core State Standards which Swartz Creek Schools is in the process of adopting as well. Core Standards can be found at:
