Guided Reading for Chapter 9

1. What were the pre-conditions that lead up to the bubonic plague? Why was Europe so vulnerable?
2. What were some of the remedies that were attempted by Europeans to fight this disease?
3. List and explain the consequences of the Black Death on the political, social and economic life of Europe.
4. What were the traditional “containers” of monarchy in 14th century Europe? How did the plague change this?

5. List and explain the causes of the 100 Years War.

6. What was the Jacquerie?

7. What were the political and social consequences of the 100 Years War?

8. Briefly explain the Papacy of the 13th century. Include in your discussion the doctrine of plenitude of power and benefices. What was the Rota Romana? What were the major criticisms of the church?

9. Discuss the struggle between Boniface and Philip the Fair. What were the issues that caused the struggle? What was the Unum Sanctum? What is the important result for this struggle?

10. What was the Avignon Papacy? Who were the major popes? How did this impact the power and the prestige of the Church?

11. Discuss the two reformers, John Wycliff and John Huss. What were their main criticisms of the Church?

12. What was the Great Schism?

13. What was the conciliar movement? Include in your answer the Council of Pisa, Council of Constance and the Council of Basil.

14. What were the consequences of the Great Schism and the conciliar movement?
