What is 31a?

Section 31a is a state funded program created to help students who for a variety of reasons find one or more of the core subjects challenging. It is designed to make gains toward reaching grade level assessments.

At the beginning of every school year, students are assessed in reading and math. These assessments determine who is entitled to the extra support provided by the Section 31a program. Throughout the year continued assessments will be done to monitor every student's progress. Our goal is to ensure every child receives the foundation they need to achieve success at school

The Section 31a Program provides your child extra instruction time either one on one in small groups or online. During this time, the NPS staff will be working on lessons created to address your child's specific needs. A variety of activities will be utilized to accommodate different learning styles.

Your Role as a Parent

You are an important member of your child's learning team! All the daily decisions you make for your child, affects how they learn in school. Success in the classroom is influenced by many outside factors. A student's attitude and motivation is affected by their daily schedule, their health and how important they see school is to the adult role models in their lives. A child who walks into school well rested, happy and feeling like what they are doing is important will achieve more. This is something to keep in mind to create successful learning plan for your child.

There are three main things you can do to help your child to triumph at school. First, be a coach to your child. Set aside time to work with your child every day especially in their challenging subjects. Even if it is only 10 minutes a day, it will make a difference in many ways. It will improve their skills, show them that their learning is important to you, and teach them good study habits. Make sure this time is relaxed and that you are celebrating improvements.

Research shows that parents working at home with a child is a key indicator of accelerated progress. We realize that many parents work, and life can get very busy. Fifteen to thirty minutes a day can make a huge difference. We will be sending home ideas for practice activities. 
