### **III. Student Learning**

The following are strategies and suggestions on how to support students at home with homework and other curriculum-related activities.

#### **A. Homework/Projects**

Homework and classroom projects are a valuable part of schooling. They allow for practicing and extending work done in class, provide parents and caregivers with insights into what is being taught in the classroom, and reaffirm the role of parents/family as partners in education. Parents can help with homework in the following ways:

1. Express interest in your child's school life on a daily basis.
2. Check your child's planner and book bag every night for homework, notes, or other information.
3. Practice math facts until they are automatic.
4. Encourage your child to read or read to them at least 20 minutes every night.
5. Assist your child with being organized. Remind him/her to bring home the materials needed to complete homework.

6. Set up a regular homework time and keep to it.
7. Make certain your child has a quiet place to complete homework without distractions.
8. Check to see that your child's homework is complete and accurate.
9. Contact the teacher if your child has difficulty understanding an assignment.
10. Attend parent workshops.
11. Refer to class syllabus for information regarding assignments.

#### IV. **Volunteering**

Parent participation in school activities demonstrates an active interest in children's studies. Academic abilities may also improve as a result of increased parental involvement in a child's school life. Greenwood Elementary has a volunteer coordinator and an active volunteer program. Each year we welcome new volunteers. If you are interested, you may sign up at any time in the school year with our volunteer coordinator. Family members may volunteer at school, however, there are jobs that can be done at home, also.
