Description of School Parental Involvement Plan

- Test Preparation (GMAS) Workshop
- Pre-K and Kindergarten Round-Up (Parents will visit the school, receive information on preparing their child for school, how to register, mandatory documents, afterschool opportunities, etc.)
- Moving Up Days for upcoming kindergarten through 5th grade students- Parents will learn about the curriculum for the upcoming school year and how to accelerate student learning over the summer.
