<b>Event</b>	<p><b>Upper School: VolunTEENs</b>          The VolunTEEN program occurs three times a year for students who are 14-16 years old. In this highly structured, 80-hour program, volunteers learn about marine life and the Pacific Ocean and then present this information to guests.</p> <p><b>Middle School: Junior Exhibit Guide</b>          Junior Exhibit Guides talk with Aquarium guests about the animals and exhibits in the Aquarium and provide an excellent guest experience for visitors. Volunteers will be trained on marine related information and skills to help them interact with the public.</p>

<b>Minimum age</b>	<b>VolunTEENS:</b> 14-16 years old <b>Junior Exhibit Guides:</b> 11-14 years old
<b>Additional information</b>	<b>VolunTEENS:</b> Volunteers are assigned a specific day of the week and will volunteer 8 hours each week for 10 weeks. After ongoing training, volunteers conclude the program with a presentation that exhibits what they have gained from this program. VolunTEENS does not offer animal care or animal training opportunities. Volunteers must have at least a 2.5 GPA, submit an application, an essay, and two letters of recommendation, and participate in an interview. <b>Junior Exhibit Guides:</b> This program is offered twice a year. Volunteers are assigned a Saturday or a Sunday shift and are expected to participate each week from 9am – 1pm on that day. Volunteers will have an eight hour training at the beginning of the program.
