Curriculum- What's going on in Math

6th Grade: 6th graders are working with ratios and rates. We are deciding which is a better buy so that we can be smart shoppers! We are seeing that a lot of math problems can be solved by using proportions and we are making connections from what we already know to new material!

7th Grade: 7th grade students have been developing their understanding of positive and negative integers. Students have learned how to add and subtract integers and are currently learning how to multiply and divide integers. In the coming weeks, students will be exploring how to change fractions to decimals. They will be applying these new skills to real world situations.

8th grade: In September, we have worked on Exponents, Rational and Irrational numbers. Currently, students are working on understanding, analyzing and graphing linear functions.
