Guidance Information

2019/2020 Scheduling

On Thursday, February 14th, Grade 9-11 students received a course selection sheet, a list of NKHS courses, the Program of Studies Quick Reference Guide, and a letter from Dr. Morse regarding the scheduling process. Teacher recommendations will be viewable on ASPEN on February 26th. Course selection sheets are due to history teachers by Friday, March 1st. Guidance counselors will be meeting with students during the month of March to review recommendations and enter elective choices.

Here is the announcement made to students today regarding the scheduling process...

"Attention all students in grades 9-11:

This morning in advisory, you will receive scheduling documents for the next school year. You will receive a letter from Dr. Morse, the *Program of Studies* quick reference guide, a list of courses, and a course selection worksheet.

You will need to submit your course selection worksheet to your history teacher by March 1st. When selecting electives, please refer to list of NKHS courses and the *Program of Studies* which can be found on our high

school website under the ACADEMICS TAB. You should prioritize your list of courses and include four alternate choices. You should select courses that you need towards graduation as a top priority. Be sure to choose either 7, 7.5 or 8 credits depending on whether you opt to have a PLT or take advantage of senior privileges, which includes late-arrival or early-dismissal. We also recommend that you speak to your individual teachers regarding your course levels for the following school year. Teacher recommendations for the next sequential class will be viewable on your Aspen account on Tuesday, February 26th.

Guidance counselors will visit all History classrooms in March to meet with each student individually; at this time, your guidance counselor will review your teacher recommendations for the next sequential class and we will add your electives in Aspen. This would be the appropriate time to ask questions about the selections you have made or to clarify any of the recommendations made by your teachers.

You should return the **course selection worksheet** to your history teacher by Friday, March 1st. We look forward to working with you throughout the scheduling process.”

CCRI Running Start

*The Running Start program is a dual enrollment program for high school seniors who have demonstrated the academic achievement and maturity necessary to enroll in college courses during their senior year of high school. Seniors who wish to study at CCRI on a full-time basis (12 credits) during the day may be eligible to earn college credit and credit toward high school graduation simultaneously. ASVAB

The ASVAB test will be given on February 28th from 7:15-10:15 in the cafeteria. All 10th, 11th, & 12th grade students are eligible to take the test. Students can register for the exam in the guidance office.

CCRI

A representative from CCRI will be at NKHS on February 20th from 9:30 - 11:30 to help seniors complete their applications. Students need to bring their chromebooks and social security numbers. Students can sign up for a session in the guidance office. A maximum of 10 students will be seen every half hour.

Final Exam Schedules

Final exams are held the last four to five days of the school year, and students are expected to be present. Please remember to leave plenty of time for calendar adjustments for snow days. As a reminder, family vacations, or other activities that could have been scheduled for after the exam times, are not excused absences. Weddings, graduations or other special occasions over which families have little control in scheduling will be considered, but please make your request for excusal as soon as possible. For students who do have excused absences for final exams, make ups will be provided during the summer months by appointment. There will be no provision for early exams, and all exams must be make up by August 1st in order to update the transcript in time for the new school year.

Change in semester 2 protocols for students

Starting in the second semester (January 28th) students will no longer be able to have backpacks and coats in their last period classes. We have altered our schedule slightly to give students two additional minutes at the end of the day before buses leave to get their items. This time will not impact instructional time.

Students are asked to get all of their items at the end of the school day. We will hold buses for the first few days as students get use to the new pattern.

The other change in protocol is that students will only be allowed in one of three entrances at the start of the school day. Students can access the Main Office doors for bus drop off, the rear set of doors near the Senior Lot and drop off zone in the back of the school and by the Weight Room for those students coming up from the Junior Lot. All other entrances will be locked.

Attendance Counts:

NKHS was VERY pleased to be given a 5 STAR rating on RIDE Accountability report card. However, it was noted that NKHS has a chronic absence rate of 11% of students beyond the acceptable 18 days absent. Let's please try to be diligent about consistent attendance.

As we approach cold and flu season, please be mindful of absences. It takes just two days per month to be truant. If a student is ill and contagious, then keep them home.

Once a student has accumulated 5 days, a letter is automatically generated. The letter serves several purposes. First, is to increase communication between home and school about attendance. It also provides an opportunity to correct any errors in a timely fashion. Please bring doctor's notes with three days of

scheduled appointment. If you receive a letter and have questions, feel free to call the Student Services office. Additionally, if you have documentation that needs to be submitted, the letter will be a nice reminder.
