Scott Gustafsson of Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co. reported on the audit that was performed for the District. He gave the Board a brief synopsis of what transpires when they come to the District. Additionally, he stated the audit does not measure the District’s financial health. This year the audit tested the Federal award in Nutrition Services, which gave a result of no findings. However, in the State award test area of the After School Education and Safety Program, there was a finding with understated attendance. In conclusion, he stated that working with this District is amazing and commended Cathy Freeburg for her great attention to detail.

11. INFORMATION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

**11.1. CALIFORNIA ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT PERFORMANCE AND PROGRESS
(CAASPP) SITE REPORTS –**

John Huber, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, stated that the presentations tonight would be a comparison of the District results and Riverside County schools. He stated that overall there was an improvement in English Language Arts while there is a concern with the results in Mathematics. Over the last three years, the District has experienced solid growth in ELA as well as in math, which the TEEM grant has played a great role in. Mr. Huber stated that the District is moving in the right direction and is experiencing the same issues as most school districts throughout the State when it comes to the low math test scores. Furthermore, he stated the District received the highest increase in the county with EL students and received the highest ELPAC scores countywide.

Daryl Drinkwater, Principal of Mountain Shadows Middle School, provided the Board with an overview of the “Dashboard” for his school. He stated that unlike the other schools the test score comparisons were not the same at his school, as he only serves two grade levels, he is unable to compare student-to-student scores. Mr. Drinkwater provided an overview of both the ELA and math test scores by sub-group and stated there had been a decline in math from the previous year. It was also reported that the school was above County average in all levels with an exception in the EL sub-group. Additionally, Mr. Drinkwater reviewed the strategies the school has implemented that will help students improve their test scores.

John Wilder, Principal of Nuview Elementary School, began his presentation by providing the Board with information regarding his student population. He stated 351 students participated in the assessments. Furthermore, Mr. Wilder reviewed the test result data by sub-group and stated that in mathematics the school improved by 7.5 points as a whole. Additionally, he stated that RFEP students tested above average. To conclude, Mr. Wilder reviewed the improvement strategies his school has implemented, such as student interventions and Dreambox math.

Erica Williams, Principal of Valley View Elementary School, stated that 311 students participated in the assessment. She went on to review the assessment scores from her school by sub-group and stated 52 RFEP students tested above average. However, she did state there was a small decline in math scores. Mrs. Williams also reviewed student improvement strategies that are being implemented at her school site. Her school has implemented the use of Dreambox math, English 3D and has increased teach collaborations.
