## **HIGH SCHOOL REGISTRATION**

**A) REGISTRATION TIMES:** In preparation for the 2019 - 2020 school year, students should report to the high school commons at the designated time to participate in the registration process. We have expanded our time options to allow for more flexibility for parents to attend registration with their students.

### **THURSDAY, AUGUST 1**

4:00 P.M – 8:00 P.M.

### **FRIDAY, AUGUST 2**

8:00 A.M. – 12:00 P.M.

All high school students are required to pay a **\$30.00** supply fee and **\$10.00** class due fee at the time of registration. With the required registration fee, students will receive a School ID and free admission to all home athletic events. Class dues are used to finance the Junior-Senior Prom and activities, which are open to all members of the class. These fees are non refundable.

**B) SCHOOL PICTURES:** This year we will be taking school pictures during the registration process. **Pictures will only be taken during registration for the high school.** Please note that for pictures:

- 1) All freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors will be photographed for yearbook and record purposes. All students will receive a School ID the first week of school.
- 2) Students who wish to purchase a picture package will be expected to pay for the package on registration/picture day or online through Lifetouch Studios.

**C) SCHEDULE CHANGES:** Schedule changes will take place the week of July 29th. Students need to schedule an appointment with the counseling office at 303-857-7119. Please keep in mind schedule changes will be granted for these reasons only; the student has already taken the class or the student needs to have a different class for graduation credits.

**D) FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL:** Freshman Orientation is **Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup>** from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. The first day of school for all students is **Monday, August 12<sup>th</sup>**. ## **STUDENT DRESS CODE**

**Parents and Students, as you shop for school clothes this summer, please be aware of the following student dress code that will be strictly enforced this coming school year.**

### **Unacceptable Items**

The following items are deemed disruptive to the classroom environment or to the maintenance of a safe and orderly school and are not acceptable in school buildings, on school grounds, or at school activities:

1. Shorts, dresses, skirts or other similar clothing shorter than mid-thigh length
2. Sunglasses and/or hats worn inside the building
3. Inappropriately sheer, tight or low-cut clothing (e.g., midriiffs, halter tops, backless clothing, tube tops, garments made of fishnet, mesh or similar material, muscle tops, etc.) that bare or expose traditionally private parts of the body including, but not limited to, the stomach, buttocks, back and breasts
4. Tank tops or other similar clothing with straps narrower than 1.5 inches in width
5. Any clothing, gloves, paraphernalia, grooming, jewelry, hair coloring, accessories, or body adornments that are or contain any advertisement, symbols, words, slogans, patches, or pictures that:
  - Refer to drugs, tobacco, alcohol, or weapons
  - Are of a sexual nature
  - By virtue of color, arrangement, trademark, or other attribute denote membership in gangs which advocate drug use, violence, or disruptive behavior
  - Are obscene, profane, vulgar, lewd, or legally libelous
  - Threaten the safety or welfare of any person
  - Promote any activity prohibited by the student code of conduct
  - Disrupts the teaching-learning process

### **Exceptions**

Appropriate athletic clothing may be worn in physical education classes. Clothing normally worn when participating in school-sponsored extracurricular or sports activities (such as cheerleading uniforms and the like) may be worn to school when approved by the sponsor or coach.

**Building principals, in conjunction with the school accountability committee, may develop and adopt school-specific dress codes that are consistent with this policy.**

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
