Established in 1956, Bishop Alemany is a four-year, co-educational high school of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Los Angeles. Current enrollment is 1,160 students. 98% of the graduating class of 2018 continued on to post-secondary education, with 70% enrolling in 4-year colleges & universities.

Accreditation and Membership

Bishop Alemany High School has been awarded the maximum six-year accreditation (through June 30, 2023) by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. It also maintains memberships in the following organizations: National Catholic Education Association, Western Catholic Education Association, The College Board, and National Association for College Admission Counseling and the Western Association for College Admission Counseling.

School Community

Bishop Alemany High School is located in the northwest San Fernando Valley, adjacent to the San Fernando Rey de España Misi3n. The school serves both Catholic and non-Catholic families from diverse socioeconomic backgrounds.

Curriculum and Graduation

Bishop Alemany provides a college preparatory curriculum, with courses in every academic department meeting four-year college admission requirements.

Courses include 9 Honors and 20 Advanced Placement offerings, including the AP Capstone Diploma program.

All courses utilize the Canvas Learning Management system, while every student is required to use an iPad and other electronic devices.
