# Zapata County ISD District and Schools 2017-2018 TEA Academic Accountability Ratings

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) has changed the way it rates districts and schools on academic accountability. For the 2017-2018 school year each district and campus was rated on **Student Achievement**, **School Progress** and **Closing the Gap**. TEA assigned districts a letter grade of an A, B, C, D or F and campuses a rating of "**Met Standard**" or "**Improvement Required**" based on their performance in the 2017-2018 academic school year.

## The A-F system is based on three domains:

- 1: "Student Achievement" measures how well students performed on the STAAR and how well high school students performed on college and career readiness measures and their graduation rates.
- 2: "School Progress" consists of two subcategories that measure how many students improved on the STAAR, as well as school and district performance compared with other campuses and districts with similar percentages of low-income students.
- **3: "Closing the Gap"** measures how well different populations of students in the district are performing.
