**Responsibilities**

- Developing and implementing 2 project-based Halacha Mini Courses each year.
- Attending daily minyanim
- Demonstrating openness to learning and implementing new methods and modalities of instruction in the classroom.
- Participating in school-wide special events, shabbatonim, and programs outside of the regular school day.

**Qualifications**

The successful candidate will have a graduate degree in Judaic Studies and / or Semicha. Preference will be given to those candidates who also have a degree in Education or a related field. The successful candidate will have a demonstrated ability to understand and reach Modern Orthodox adolescents, while conducting themselves in a manner that models a sophisticated, integrated, and inspired Torah life. In addition, the successful candidate will exhibit a collaborative growth mindset and the aspiration to continuously improve in all aspects of their role.
