- On the QuickLinks, select Schoology.
- Then select the Schoology for Students/Teachers link.

GOAL 3: Log in to Schoology

- If you already are logged in to your school gmail account (which happens when you log in to your chromebook), you will automatically be logged in to Schoology when you click on the Schoology link.
- If you are not logged in to your school gmail account and are prompted to log in to Schoology, use your RB email address as your Schoology user name and RB email password as your Schoology password.

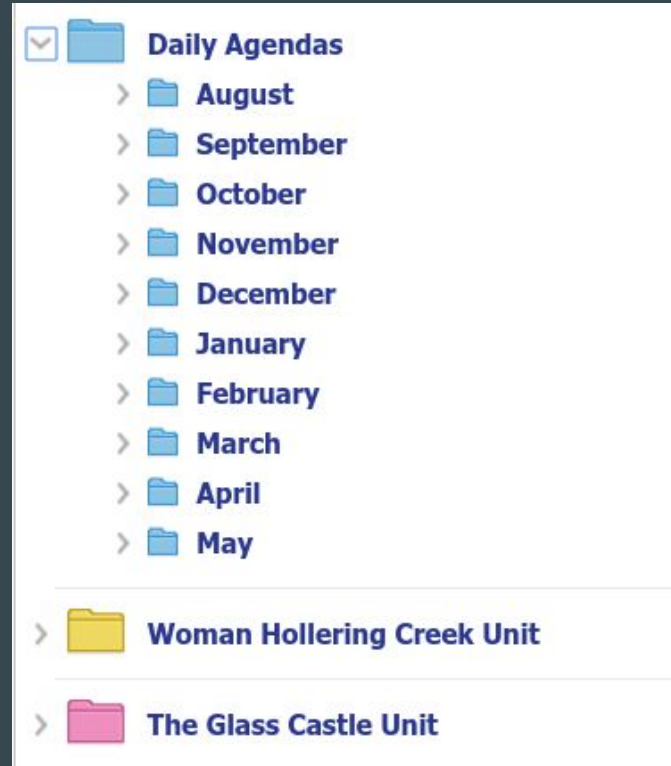
