

Scranton School District Summer Reading Connecting to People in Non-fiction For Students Entering Grades 6, 7, and 8

DIRECTIONS:

- -Choose your reading material! You may select a non-fiction book from the Scranton School District's grade appropriate extensive list or read an article about a person who has contributed something worthwhile to society. This list is available on the Scranton School District website: scrsd.org
- -Read the book or the article!
- -When you have finished reading the book/article, choose a person from the story and record the following information on a 4x6 index card.

INDEX CARD REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Place a small, wallet-sized picture of the person from the story on the top left corner of the index card. This can be a hand drawn or printed picture.
- 2. Place the title of the book, the author, and the name of the person you chose at the top of the index card.
- 3. Write 1-2 sentences describing the person's importance in the story.
- 4. Write 1-2 sentences telling which of the Six Pillars of Character Education that connects to the person. The Six Pillars of Character Education are listed on the back of this sheet.
- 5. Proved text evidence to show how the person is connected to the pillar. You must use a direct quote from the story and provide the page number on which it appears.
- 6. Write 1-2 sentences explaining how you have connected to the person.
- 7. Write your name and grade on the bottom of the card.



The Outsiders by S.E. Hinton JOHNNY CADE

One of the main characters in <u>The Outsiders</u> is Johnny Cade. He is best friends with Ponyboy and he has an abusive father. Although Johnny is a member of the Greaser gang, he is a reliable and caring friend. This reflects the Pillar of Trustworthiness and the Pillar of Caring.

In chapter one, Ponyboy describes each of the Greasers, and states, "If it hadn't been for the gang, Johnny would never have known what love and affection are" (page 92). This quote demonstrates how important it is to have close friends who care for you. I connected with Johnny's character because I have caring friends in my life as well.
