# Financial Aid Application Checklist

## What you need to complete your FAFSA:

- Your Social Security Number
- Your parent(s)' social security numbers (if applicable) \*Please note: if you have a SSN and your parents do not, you are still eligible to apply for FAFSA
- Parents marital status and date (if applicable)
- Your driver's license # (if you have one)
- 2018 federal tax forms for your parent(s)/guardian(s) and IRS W-2 forms
- Student's 2018 federal tax forms (if you filed in 2018)
- Records of yours and parent(s)/guardian(s) untaxed income (ex: child support received, interest income, and veterans noneducation benefits)
- Information on cash, savings, and checking account balances; investments, including stocks, bonds, and real estate; business and farm assets for you and your parent(s)/guardian(s) (not including the home you live in)
- List of colleges you are interested in attending

- 2018 federal tax forms for your parent(s)/guardian(s) and IRS W-2 forms
