Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2017-2018 educational progress for Airport Senior High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2017-2018 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has been identified as a Michigan Department of Education Rewards School in previous school years when this form of scorecard was utilized, but this previous school year, our school has not been given one of these labels.

Airport High School has experienced a slight increase in academic growth in all subject areas from the previous testing cycle. We continue to recognize a need for more student teacher interaction time. We look forward to improving all scores, in particular, by continuing to offer an online based math curriculum, and an intervention, or MTSS (multi-tiered system of support) program, which works with struggling math and ELA students at a specific hour during their scheduled day. Airport High School will also offer the availability of teacher tutoring services every Tuesday after school until 3:00 to provide additional support, in any subject, for the 2017-2018 school year as we have done in previous years. Airport High School also continues to partner with Monroe County Community College, to offer the Upward Bound Program to all students that qualify. Both tutoring services, the Tuesday after school staff time and Upward Bound Program, are available at no extra cost to the students that participate in them. We have also expanded our career and technical course options for students to include welding and criminal justice for the up-coming school year.

Also, continuing this school year at Airport High School, we offer a joint early middle college program with Schoolcraft College in Livonia, MI. Students that are interested in a career in

Computer Information Systems or General Business, will have the opportunity to earn a high school diploma, as well as an associate's degree or certificate of completion concurrently. Next school year we are expanding the program to include a criminal justice program and computer programming class as options as well. All the while, never needing to leave the Airport High School campus. All classes are completed on line with support from the Airport High School staff and Schoolcraft College staff. This is a tremendous program for our students and the only model of such an early middle college program that we aware of.

Below, you will see some of the dual enrollment, advanced placement class offering, and parent teacher conference information.

- 31 dual enrollment students = 4%
- 12 AP classes were offered (9 were scheduled)
- 238 students were enrolled in AP classes which equals 32% of our students

We take tremendous pride in educating all students at Airport High School. Our very dedicated staff works tirelessly to ensure students are college and career ready when they leave our walls. This dedication and persistence leads to a better learning environment and a place where all students, regardless of learning style and pace of learning, can be successful and productive upon graduation.
