The Bridges Charter School’s Governing Board recognizes that the purpose of the school’s sexual health and HIV/AIDS prevention instruction is to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to protect them from unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases and to encourage students to develop healthy attitudes concerning adolescent growth and development, body image, gender roles, sexual orientation, dating, marriage, and family. The Board therefore desires to provide a well-planned sequence of instruction on comprehensive sexual health and HIV/AIDS prevention.

SCOPE:

Bridges Charter School’s curriculum shall be aligned with the state's content standards, based on medically accurate and factual information, and designed to teach students to make healthy choices and reduce high-risk behaviors. Bridges Charter School program shall comply with the requirements of law and Board policy, and shall respect the rights of parents/guardians to supervise their children's education on these subjects and to impart values regarding human sexuality to their children.

GENERAL POLICY:

The Bridges Charter School’s Governing Board also believes that health education should foster the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that students need in order to lead healthy lives and avoid high-risk behaviors. Bridges Charter School’s health education program shall be part of a coordinated school health system which supports the well-being of students and is linked to district and community services and resources.

POLICY DETAILS:

1. Goals for the Bridges Charter School’s health education program shall be designed to promote student wellness and shall include, but not be limited to, goals for nutrition education and physical activity.

2. The Executive Director or designee shall provide periodic reports to the Board regarding the implementation and effectiveness of the school's health education program which may include, but not be limited to, a description of the school's program and the extent to which it is aligned with the state's content standards and curriculum framework, the amount of time allotted for health instruction at each grade level, and student achievement of district standards for health education.

Parent/Guardian Consent

1. A parent/guardian may request in writing that his/her child be excused from participating in HIV/AIDS prevention or sexual health education. Students so excused by their parents/guardians shall be given an alternative educational activity. (Education Code 51240, 51939)
2. A student shall not be subject to disciplinary action, academic penalty, or other sanction if the student's parent/guardian declines to permit the student to receive the instruction. (Education Code 51939)
