Student Academic Achievement

Student Academic Achievement Summary

As a Campus 72% of our students met the approaches level on all STAAR Exams. On the Reading Exam 73% met the standard. On the Mathematics Exam 74% met the Expectation. On the Writing Exam 63% of our students met the Expectation. On the Science Exam 76% of our students met the expectation. On the Social Studies Exam 65% of the students met the expectation.

Within the Hispanic Population, 67% of our students met the expectation on all tests. In Reading 70% met the expectation. In Math 69% met the expectation. In Writing 60% met the expectation. In Science 73% met the expectation. In Social Studies 53% met the expectation.

Within the Economic Disadvantaged population, 59% met the expectation on all tests. In Reading 60% met the expectation. In Mathematics 60% met the expectation. In writing 48% met the expectation, In Science 64% met the expectation. In Social Studies 54% met the expectation.

Within the SPED population, 25% met the standard on all tests. In Reading, 25% met the standard. In Math, 29% met the standard. In Science, 33% met the standard.

The data also indicates that we need to increase the number of students that are performing at the advanced level and continue to work towards improving the SPED and Economically Disadvantage test scores.
