### **National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)**

*West Cheatham 4<sup>th</sup> graders will take the reading and math NAEP scheduled for Jan 8 – March 8, 2019.*

The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) is the largest national assessment with results representative of what students across the United States know and can do in various subject areas. The assessments are administered periodically online and in pencil/paper format in math, reading, science, writing, the arts, civics, economics, geography, US History, technology, and engineering literacy.

**NAEP results are reported for different demographic groups rather than for individual students or schools.** Within a school, just some of the student population participates, and student responses are combined with those from other participating students to produce the results. Student responses on NAEP are confidential, and the privacy of each participating school and student is essential.\* Names of participating students never leave the school and are not associated with the digital or paper test booklet after the student takes the assessment.

### **TCAP TNReady Test**

*Grades 3-8; English Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies are scheduled for April 15-May 3, 2019;*

The Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP) TNReady assessment for English language arts is a four-part timed assessment with one section designed to assess writing. The TCAP TNReady assessment for math is a three-part timed assessment with one section consisting of non-calculator items. The TCAP TNReady test for science standards is a timed assessment consisting of two parts. The TCAP TNReady social studies is a timed assessment consisting of two parts. The results of these examinations will be factored into the student's grade at a percentage determined by the State Board of Education in accordance with T.C.A. §49-1-302 (2). Parents will receive a paper copy of the student report by September for the previous spring assessment. ### **Universal Screener**

*Grades K-8; Beginning of year (BOY) August-September 1, 2018, Middle of the Year (MOY) November 1-December 15, 2018, and End of the Year (EOY) February 26-March 9, 2019;*

EasyCBM is the districts universal screener to review the performance and progress of all students through brief assessments in reading and math. Universal screenings help schools identify students who may need more support or other types of instruction through Response to Intervention (RTI2). Parents will receive notification of results if their child requires Tier II or III interventions.
