

# 2020 BY THE NUMBERS

## Educator for All Ages and Abilities

**15,753**

students' unique needs were supported in special education classrooms operated by a BOCES.

**3,741**

students' academic, social and emotional needs were met in BOCES alternative education programs.

**96.1%**

(on average) of seniors enrolled in BOCES career and technical education programs graduated from high school.

**38,442**

students developed college- and career-ready skills through CTE programs taught by BOCES.

**12,036**

adult students improved their listening, speaking and literacy skills through English as a Second Language (ESL) programs at BOCES.

**11,491**

credits were earned by students enrolled in specialized high school programs.

**10,476**

adult students broadened their employment options by taking High School Equivalency (HSE) courses taught by a BOCES.

Within 1 year of graduation, **more than half** of 2018 BOCES graduates went on to college, and **more than one-third** were employed, on average across all BOCES.

## Engine for Economic Growth

**20,751**

adult students improved their job prospects by enrolling in BOCES workforce development courses.

**2,575**

high school students advanced their learning through New Tech High School, Early College High School and P-TECH programs that are closely linked with business and higher education.

**1,364**

students worked side-by-side with industry professionals in honors-level career courses through BOCES New Visions programs.

**395**

businesses around the state partnered with BOCES to provide training for their staff.

**5,407**

Representatives from businesses served on BOCES CTE advisory councils.

**66 new**

**CTE programs**

have been developed through partnerships and guidance from local businesses.

districts share central business office staff or functions via BOCES.

**2,075**

colleges and universities have joined articulation agreements with BOCES CTE programs.

**213,054**

staff members were able to participate in professional development workshops through BOCES.

**\$4.7 million**

was saved by the school districts participating in BOCES energy cooperatives in one year.

**377**
