Dear Advanced Placement Student,

It is hard to believe that AP Exams are just around the corner. With that said, you have been working hard all year to prepare for this exam, and thus I want to provide you with some important information that will help ensure that your test day goes smoothly. The attached schedule gives you the exact day, time, and room where your AP Exam(s) will be administered. All students need to be lined up with their ID in hand, for morning exams **by 7:30 am (please arrive earlier)**. Instructions will begin promptly. Students who are testing in the afternoon will be **excused at 11:15 am** and are expected to eat lunch **provided from home** in the cafeteria. They need to be lined up with their ID in hand by **12:15 pm (again earlier is better)**. **No student may be admitted after the exam has been started.** Students who have sports or late afternoon commitments should notify coaches or those in charge that under **no circumstances** will any student be allowed to leave the exam room early.

Since the May 2004 AP exam administration, **cell phones and other electronic devices have been prohibited** from the exam room and may not be used during the break. If a student uses a cell phone, I-watch, MP3 player, or any other electronic device in the exam room or during the break, the device will be confiscated and the student **dismissed from testing**. Despite these warnings, hundreds of students have had their exam grades cancelled because they had used a cell phone during the test administration or on the break. Thus, **please leave your cell phone at home or in your car or locker** on AP exam day so that you don't forget and bring it into the testing room.

Students should **bring the following** to the exam room:

- A valid photo ID (If you don't have one go to one of the houses before going to your AP room).
- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for all multiple-choice answer sheets (**no mechanical pencils**).
- **Pens with black or dark blue ink** (please bring a pen to all exams).
- A watch (without a beeper or alarm). **I-Watches are not allowed.**
- Up to 2 calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking the AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam; extra batteries are recommended. - A ruler or straightedge for the AP Physics Exam. **Protractors are not allowed.**

Students should **not bring the following** to the exam room:

- **Cell phones, I-Watches**, digital cameras, personal digital assistants, BlackBerry Smartphones, Bluetooth-enabled devices, MP3 players, e-mail/messaging devices, or any other electronic or communication devices.
- A book, colored pencils, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, **mechanical pencils**, or notes.
- Rulers and straightedges (except as previously noted).
- Scratch paper (notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets).
- Computers (except as noted for students with disabilities), or calculators (except as noted above).
- Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- Portable listening or recording devices (even with headphones) or photographic equipment.
- Food or drink (**you can bring a snack for your ten minute break but you must take it out of your back pack before the exam begins**).
- Clothing with subject related information.

Finally, I highly recommend that you get a good night's sleep and eat a nutritional breakfast or lunch prior to your testing administration. In the event of illness please have your parents notify the attendance office, we will need a note from your physician for you to be allowed to take the make up exam.
