

SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

November 16, 2017

Minutes: Minutes from the October 19, 2017, meeting were reviewed. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Karen Myers and seconded by Krissy Derugen.

New Business:

Tree Removal at PVHS- Additional trees were removed in High School Construction Site Area F to reduce the risk of future damage to the new high school administration area. The tree removal will provide better views for entry by staff, students and visitors once the project is complete. A PSP trooper also commented that removing the trees will give emergency responders better visibility during safety rounds and incident response.

PVHS Signage- The signs for the high school parent drop-off area/parking lot arrived today. These should help define the proper lane to keep cars and vans separated while loading and unloading student vans.

RVAT Risk Survey- Mr. Miller and Dr. Griffith reviewed the State Police Risk and Vulnerability Assessment Team report and bulleted recommendations that will be added to the budget. There were many positive comments about what the District is currently doing. The Facilities Committee will discuss the recommendations at the next meeting.

School-zone Signs- Mr. Miller talked with PennDot regarding the flashing school-zone signs on Rt. 45. Even though Rt.45 is congested at 7:30AM, the school zone signs are permitted for specific times and cannot be changed.

Old Business:

Power Outage/Surge- The District continues to replace damaged electrical components from the power outage/surge that occurred on October 15-16, 2017. Currently, we have an estimated cost of \$60,000+ of equipment being replaced. The outage/surge damaged a wide range of building automation equipment, surge protection devices, parking lot lighting, HVAC equipment and water system controls. Most of the damaged equipment has been ordered for replacement and some items are being manufactured for delivery. The CHE rooftop compressor unit is the most expensive item (replacement with COSTAR pricing) that was damaged. At the high school, the discolored water problem was caused by the well water turbidimeters being damaged during the power surge.

High School Parking- Traffic flow concerns at the High School have not been an issue or major problem but will continue to be monitored by Principal Dalton. There was a student vehicle accident in the high school parking lot. The one car was damaged but no people were injured.

Work Place Safety Concerns: There has been severe damage to the sidewalk near the high school auditorium from construction equipment. Grounds crew is adding crushed stone and orange cones to decrease the tripping hazard, especially for people attending the play tonight.

Accident Review: A female high school student fell down and scraped her chin and knee when the stadium lights were turned off after the Powder Puff game.
