RFISD New Teachers Introduced at Board Meeting

RFISD Board Adopts District Goals

RFISD Enrollment Is Lower Compared to 2018 Start

Randolph Field ISD opening enrollment for 2019 was slightly lower with 1393 students when compared to the 1430 students we opened 2018 with. However, it is common for us to see an increase in students through the month of September. A consistent student population benefits the district in several ways, including maintaining an adequate budget. We have advertised on the district website that a few spots remain open in RFISD. We appreciate the desire for new families to have their children attend RFISD, and we will continue to provide the best education possible in the safest environment possible to all students.

RFISD Receives Grant to Purchase New Busses

Brandon Casey and Lorrie Remick worked to submit a grant to purchase six new busses. Thanks to their efforts, RFISD has been awarded the grant to pay for 75% of the cost. This is an excellent opportunity to purchase six new 2020 busses at a fraction of the cost, and will bring our fleet up to date. Thank you to Brandon and Lorrie for making this happen for our students and drivers.

RFISD Board Hears Report Update on Long Range Facilities Plan

The Superintendent gave an update to the Board of Trustees regarding the new construction at the secondary campus. The old HS has been demolished and the new parking lots with parent traffic loops are complete and operational. Plans are being made to renovate the old cafeteria into a multi-purpose facility, add landscaping and a flag pole plaza to the green space in front of the HS building, bring the stucco arched awning across the rest of the campus up to the new cafetorium, and add some fencing for safety. Funding for a new elementary has been requested. We anticipate a response by the end of September. This is an exciting time as we work to provide the type of facilities that our students and staff deserve.
