



Accelerated Bridge Program

The Accelerated Bridge Program, or ABP, is an individualized instruction program designed to address the educational needs of kindergarten through seventh-grade students performing at least one grade above grade level. ABP provides both accelerated instruction and academic mentoring to bridge gaps in weaker subjects.

ABP teachers use a differentiated curriculum that ensures the individual academic needs of each student are met and that the student's skills and potential are optimized. Students who are selected may have an opportunity to advance at least one grade level based on their academic performance, standardized test scores and results from grade placement examination.



Participation in the program is voluntary. Once in the program, students must maintain a 90 percent grade average and should not have any grades less than 80 percent in any individual subject area. Additionally, students must maintain a conduct grade of 'S' or higher in all classes and must pass all required standardized and/or state assessments (Stanford 10, STAAR).
