Appropriate levels of English I, Geography, Algebra I, and Biology are based on test scores and/or 8th grade teacher recommendations. Students who score below a designated cut score on the reading test must enroll in Literacy Workshop. 8th Grade teachers will make recommendations for students who must enroll in an additional math support course.

A freshman should enroll and earn a minimum of 7.0 credits per year. A freshman, in addition to the required courses, should take 1 to 4 electives, depending on elective course length, i.e. full year (F) or semester (S).
