Ideas para practicar:

- Netflix, Hulu, Amazon Prime en español. **Es preferible ver programas que son originalmente de países hispanohablantes** pero también puedes ver tus programas favoritos en español o mirar una película que ya conoces en español.
 - Si es difícil entender, usa subtítulos, pero **primero intenta usar los subtítulos en español**.
 - Fíjate en los detalles de otra cultura – las viviendas, la comida, el estilo de vida, etc
- Películas en español. (Busca películas de otros países en vez de películas estadounidenses traducidas al español)
- Deportes en español. Este verano va a haber la Copa Mundial de Fútbol de Mujeres. Si ya vas a mirar un partido, míralo en español. No tienes que entender todas las palabras porque ya vas a saber lo que está pasando en el partido. También puedes escuchar los partidos de los Dodgers y Angels en la radio en español.
- Ver los noticieros en español (Telemundo, etc).
- Crear un playlist en Spotify con por lo menos 20 canciones en español.
- La radio en español – K-Love 107.5, Recuerdo 98.3/103.9, Zona MX 101.9, José 97.5, KTNQ 1020am, La Suavecita 107.1
- Podcasts en español – TED en Español, Conclusiones (CNN en Español), Españolistas, El oso latino, Hablemos español – learn Spanish podcast, www.audiria.com – podcast nuevo cada día, Spanish Obsessed, Notes in Spanish Intermediate

PROGRAMA	TEMA
Gran Hotel	Set at the turn of the century, a young man applies for a job at a hotel to investigate his sisters' disappearance. Forbidden romance, intrigue, and danger follows as the truth comes to light. <i>Set in Spain. Watch if you liked Downton Abbey and Poldark. TV-PG</i>
Nailed It Mexico	The fun, fondant and hilarious cake fails head to <i>Mexico</i> , where very amateur bakers compete to re-create elaborate sweet treats for a cash prize. <i>Set in Mexico. TV-PG</i>
Velvet	This is a gorgeous series if you like period pieces and don't mind a little soapy drama. What makes the show are the supporting characters. Good aesthetics, clever dialogue, and lively personalities. (Velvet Colección, a spin-off series, is now available as well!) <i>Set in Spain. Watch if you liked Mad Men and Downton Abbey. TV-14</i>
Siempre bruja	Starring an Afro-Colombian time-traveling witch, <i>Siempre Bruja</i> mixes the feel of a historical telenovela with modern supernatural twists. Carmen, a slave living in the 17th century, is condemned to be burned at the stake after her owners discover she and their son are in love. Carmen makes a deal to with a wizard and finds herself in modern-day Cartagena, where she must navigate her new surroundings on the condition that she not use her powers. <i>Set in Colombia. Watch if you liked Buffy the Vampire Slayer, Arrow, or Alias Grace. TV-14</i>
Luis Miguel	A dramatized telling of Luis Miguel's life and rise to fame as the <i>Sol de México</i> . The story moves between his early years of stardom and childhood, exploring the disappearance of his mother and tortured relationship with his father. Not an easy watch in terms of the family dynamics, but <i>Luis Miguel</i> just might be a breath of fresh air for viewers looking for a violence-free Latin American show. <i>Set mainly in Mexico. Watch if you liked Nashville or Empire. (Might not be on Netflix)</i>
Sor Juna Inés de la Cruz	A look at the life of Juana Ines, an outspoken nun in the 17th century who was a self-taught scholar, philosopher, and poet. <i>Set in Mexico. Watch if you liked The Crown and Alias Grace. TV-14</i>
Celia	Learn the story behind the Queen of Salsa: how she began her career in the tumultuous years of Cuba in the 50's, and eventually rose to be one of the top salsa performers of all time. Gorgeous filming and music in this series. <i>Set mostly in Cuba. Watch if you liked Luis Miguel. TV-14</i>
El internado	Set in a remote boarding school, both students and teachers become involved in uncovering dark secrets from the school's past, as strange events begin to occur in this mystery-thriller. <i>Set in Spain. TV-PG</i>
La esclava blanca	A white woman is rescued from death and raised by slaves in Colombia. She must impersonate a rich marchioness and marry a wealthy American in order to return one day and bring justice to those who saved her life. <i>Set in Colombia and Spain. TV-14</i>
Go! Vive a tu manera	A musical series created for a pre-teen and teen audience. Mía Cáceres is a talented young singer who gets a scholarship to Saint Mary, an elite prep school with a prestigious music program. There she meets both friends and arch-enemies (namely, the daughter of the school's owners who is determined to sabotage her musical dreams). <i>Set in Argentina. TV-PG</i>
Silvana sin lana	A wealthy family's life comes crashing down when the dad leaves and their fortune is lost. The mother must get a real job and the kids have to adjust to a "normal" life. I haven't seen this one to the end, but the first episodes are pretty clean and funny. <i>Set in the US. TV-14</i>
Soy Luna	An Argentine telenovela produced in partnership with Disney, this series is currently on Netflix in some countries. A teenage girl who loves to skate moves to Buenos Aires with her parents. <i>Set in Argentina (Might not be on Netflix)</i>
