Plot - The **plot** is the series of events that give a story its meaning and effect. What are the main events that happen in the **beginning**, the **middle**, and the **end** of the novel? Make sure the events are in order. You do not have to put every event, but you should put all main events. Think of this as a **SUMMARY** of the novel.

Beginning

(10 points - to receive all 10 points you need to show a knowledge of the beginning of the book. Write in complete sentences.)

Middle

(10 points - to receive all 10 points you need to show a knowledge of the middle of the book. Write in complete sentences.)

End

(10 points - to receive all 10 points you need to show a knowledge of the end of the book. Write in complete sentences.)

Journal Entry- (50 pts - to receive all 50 points you need write two to three paragraphs, the journal entry needs to adhere to the prompt and show knowledge of the text.)

Choose one of the following options for your entry. You are expected to write two to three paragraphs paragraphs words. This may be typed or handwritten. Sentences must begin with capital letters and end with proper punctuation. Plagiarism will result in a grade of "0."

Here is the list of options to choose from:

1. Imagine that you are a character in the book, and write a diary entry about your experiences, thoughts, and feelings.
2. Write a letter to a character in the book, giving her or him advice about specific situations from the book.
3. Imagine that you are the author of the book, and describe what happened to one of the characters years before or years after the time of the book.
4. Review the book. Give your opinions about it; cite examples and quotes from the book to support why you think it is an interesting book or not. Would you recommend it to a friend? Why or why not?
