UT Program Puts Students in Fast Lane

A new program has come to Lancaster High School and it has been receiving a lot of attention.

OnRamps is a dual enrollment program that gives students a regular high school course along with a college credit for a chosen subject. It was founded at the University of Texas in 2011 to give students the opportunity to gain the college learning experience before going to college.

“This year the students were all self selected based off of test scores and teacher recommendations. In the future, we’ll have to put together a plan on how students will be admitted,” says Lancaster ISD Advanced Academic Coordinator Kaneka Brock.

This is the program’s pilot year at the school, but it already has 50 eleventh grade students enrolled.

The program has multiple courses that can be taken like Geoscience, Algebra, Computer Science, Physics, etc. but the school currently only offers 2 courses, World History and English 3 for juniors.

“We are looking at offering more classes so that more students can take advantage of the opportunity,” said Brock.

This program will continue to grow and the students in the program along with it.
