Winstead Elementary Parent & Family Engagement Policy is intended to engage parents in ongoing and meaningful communication about student academic learning and other school activities ensuring parents and families:

1. play an integral role in assisting their child's learning;
2. become actively involved in their child's education; and
3. become full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.

Winstead Elementary believes that the education of children is a cooperative effort between parents and schools.
