- **Saturday June 8th Fire Safety and Building–**

Join us for a fun afternoon where we will learn fire safety, how to build a fire, primitive fire skills like friction fires using bow drill kits, complete a fire challenge, and more! Youth can keep the friction fire kit to practice with an adult at your next campfire.

- **Friday June 14th Knife Safety and Carving–**

For this exciting program youth will learn and memorize the seven rules of knife safety and practice basic carving skills using MoraKniv companion fixed blade knives. Youth will bring home their carved “Rabbit Throwing Sticks” and can keep the knife for an extra \$25.

- **Friday June 28th Finding Fossils–**

On this afternoon youth will learn about the environmental conditions of the Texas Hill Country that helped form the amazing fossil beds and common fossils found in the area. This program includes a fossil mold activity and students will learn to identify common fossils during a fossil dig on our “Fossil Rim” .

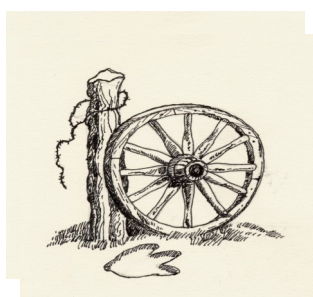
- **Friday July 12th Digging Up Dinosaurs—**

Youth will follow in the footsteps of prehistoric giants as we explore the dinosaur trackways and foot prints left from visitors long ago, and learn about the types of dinosaurs we had in Texas through hands on activities and a “Dino Dig”.

- **Friday July 26th Tracking Texas Wildlife-**

Explore the property looking for and learning to identify the tracks, scat and signs of common Texas native wildlife. Students will make track molds, complete other tracking activities, and play tracking games .
