



## Norwin School District to Participate in Remake Learning Days

Remake Learning Days is known as the region’s “largest open house of hands-on learning.” Through the month of May, hundreds of events are held throughout Southwestern Pennsylvania to allow students the opportunity to experience STEAM education. Norwin will be hosting two events as part of the program.

Norwin Elementary Schools will be hosting a “Coding Carnival” for 2nd grade students throughout the week of May 13th. Students in the 3rd and 4th grade SEAL classes will be guiding 2nd graders through stations to explore coding through Code.org, Osmo, CAD programming with 3D printing, Bee Bot Robots, and an unplugged activity that teaches algorithms. The “Coding Carnival” will be open to the public on Thursday evening, May 16th, from 5:00-7:00 at Sunset Valley Elementary School. That same evening, visitors can also tour the Sunset Valley Art Show from 6:00-8:00.

Students and community members are also invited to a STEAM Exploratory at Norwin High School Library. Participants can explore virtual worlds using Google Cardboards or even create their own 360 degree photographs. Other activities include light up greeting cards using simple circuits and short films using stop motion animation kits. Additionally, attendees will be introduced to apps, websites, and books that can expand their sense of how art and technology are intertwined.
