NEW CHARGE POLICY

Students have use of a meal account. When the balance reaches \$0.00 a student may charge no more than **\$5.00** to this account.

Families may add money to student's account by sending money with student to school or dropping off at the school office.

Students who qualify for free meals shall never be denied a reimbursable meal, even if they have accrued a negative balance from previous purchases. Students with outstanding meal charge debt shall be allowed to purchase a meal if the student pays for the meal when it is received. The Mount Ayr School district may provide an alternate meal that meets federal and state requirements to students who have charged the maximum allowance to the student account and cannot pay out of pocket for a meal.

Employees are not allowed to charge a negative balance to their lunch accounts.

Negative Account Balances

The school district will make reasonable efforts to notify families when meal account balances are low. Additionally, the school district will make reasonable efforts to collect unpaid meal charges classified as delinquent debt. The school district will coordinate communications with families to resolve the matter of unpaid charges. Families will be notified of account balances once the balance reaches \$5.00 for single student accounts, or \$10 for family accounts. Families will be notified by the Text Caster notification system, text message, or paper note sent home with the student. Any negative balances not paid prior to the end of each month will be turned over to the superintendent or superintendent's designee-for collection. Options may include: collection agencies, small claims court, or any other legal method permitted by law.
