To attend kindergarten, your child must be 5 years old on or before August 31, 2018.

Documents needed for registration include the following:

1. Proof of birth (one of these documents)
 - a. State birth certificate
 - b. hospital birth certificate
 - c. baptismal papers
2. Immunization Records
3. Proof of Residency (two current, monthly recurring utility bills, current term lease, property tax bill, or a deed with the parent/guardian's name and address on them)
4. Parent/guardian state issued photo ID such as a driver's license.

Kindergarten is an exciting time for both children and adults. We look forward to meeting you and your child and working together during the 2018 – 2019 school year!

- Reading should be a part of the day. Do not make it a punishment and have your child miss other fun summer activities by keeping them inside to read.
- Reward your child's reading progress. Add a seashell or stone to a bucket each time your child reads a book. When you have filled it up, do a fun summer activity together!

Counselor's Corner

A growing body of research is showing social-emotional learning as an essential component of student success. Without skills to manage stress, to empathize with people from diverse backgrounds and perspectives, and to engage successfully in the small-group work required for deeper learning, students cannot be successful. Students of all ages must be able to build and maintain skills that go beyond subject-matter knowledge in English, math, and science. Skills such as goal-setting, pro-social bonding, decision-making, media literacy, conflict resolution, and effective communication skills are essential to prepare students for learning. Below are some creative ways your students can continue to practice the skills they learned during the school year:

Goal Setting

- Set a goal to wake up earlier than usual in the morning during the summer to work on a project or hobby.
- Make a plan to read a certain number of books during the summer months.

Decision Making

- Contribute ideas to where your family will visit for summer vacation this year.
- Take the initiative on what movie to see with your friends.

Express Yourself

- Keep a journal of all the fun and exciting things you do over the summer.
- Talk honestly to an older sibling about how you feel about them going away to college or a different school in the fall.

Bonding and Relationships

- Try a summer activity with your friends that you have never done before.
- Limit screen time and talk with friends rather than communicating over social media.

Health Room News

During the month of May, there are many activities and events planned outdoors. Sometimes the students will be outside for the majority of the day. The weather in May can be unpredictable- anything from chilly to very hot and sunny.

Please plan accordingly when dressing your child for outdoor activities so that they can enjoy the day. You may send sunscreen to school with a note, the student may apply it themselves in the health room with supervision from the nurse. If your child needs an inhaler, please make sure the nurse has a doctor's note and the medication available at school.



SLIP- dress in light layers

SLOP-apply sunscreen to all exposed areas

SLAP- send a hat with a visor to protect faces and eyes

SEEK- shade during the most intense periods of sun exposure

SLIDE- sunglasses

WATER- hydration is very important, but particularly when it is hot and they are active

Attention parents of fifth graders

The Pennsylvania Department of Health requires **sixth grade students** to have a well-child exam completed by a health care provider. This requirement may be completed by the student's primary care provider (MD, DO, CRNP, PA) or by the school provider.

Please schedule a well-child exam appointment with your child's health care provider and return a visit summary or physical form along with an updated list of immunizations to your child's school nurse by **November 15, 2018**. Your child needs to have proof of receiving both the *Meningococcal* (Meningitis) and *Tdap* (Pertussis and Tetanus) vaccines prior to the first day of seventh grade.

Transportation for the 2018/2019 school year

The Transportation Department requests that you complete and submit a new babysitter/split custody transportation request form each year if you are utilizing a babysitter/daycare provider or split custody. You may obtain a copy from your student's school or the district's web site at:

If we do not receive your request, then your student's stop will revert back to the home stop. Thank you for your assistance in ensuring we have the most updated information for your student(s).

There are times when we are asked if a new stop can be made. This type of request does take a minimum of two weeks to coordinate and process the information (weather permitting). Such requests would require us to go out and look at a house location to make a better determination if the request can or cannot be done. We ask if you would help us locate you easier, by ensuring your address is clearly posted, and no less than 3 inches tall and visible from both directions and not obstructed from trees, shrubs etc.

Please remind your student(s) of proper bus stop behavior by standing at the stop, and not playing games or horsing around and not going onto or disturbing someone else's property. Also, please remind your student(s) there are several bus rules and one of them are that there is NO food nor drink permitted on the school bus. There is the potential for another student to have an allergic reaction to that item.

Approximately two weeks before school starts, the transportation department will send out e-mails with your student(s) most current stop location/time information. Please remember to ensure your student(s) are at the assigned bus stop five minutes prior to their stop time ready to board the bus. Also, keep the school and your skyward data updated with your most current phone number(s) and email address(s) to enable prompt communication. If you do need to make a stop change, please submit that in writing to the transportation department and allow a minimum of two weeks for the changes to be made.

SUNSCREEN REMINDER FOR UPCOMING OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES:

Sunscreen is important to protect children because they are very susceptible to sunburn. Due to many skin sensitivities and sunscreen allergies, if you want your child to wear sunscreen during a trip or activity it should be applied by an adult before the student comes to school. If sunscreen needs to be re-applied during school hours, please send in sunscreen with your child's name written on it, and a note giving permission for our nurse or parent helpers to supervise your child applying their sunscreen.
