Buckhannon Upshur Middle School art dept. had 18 pieces of artwork, both 2D and 3D, from 6th, 7th and 8th grade, chosen for the annual Arts Alive Showcase. This event, sponsored by the WVDE, highlights the best art, music and theatre work of K-12 students throughout WV.
