4. 2019 Locher Agricultural Scholarship - Imperial County: The Imperial County Locher Scholarship is made available by the estate of Carl and Kathy Locher, combining their passions for education and agriculture. The \$5,500 scholarship is being offered to a graduating Imperial County senior who is planning to study agriculture. The scholarship will be paid in three installments of \$2,000 freshman year, \$2,000 sophomore year and \$1,500 junior year. Sophomore and junior year scholarships will be paid after proof of continued enrollment with an agricultural related major and a minimum GPA of 2.5. The requirements are to be a member of FFA and/ or 4-H for a minimum for three years, graduating from an Imperial County High School , have a minimum High School GPA of 2.3 and must be pursuing an agriculture related major at accredited 2-year or 4-year college/ university or vocational school.
