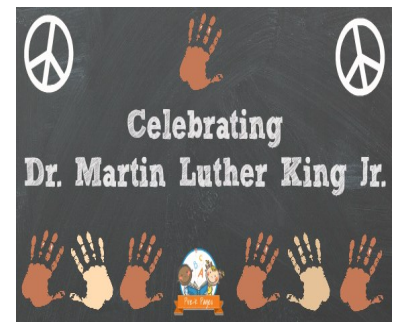


KISD will be hosting a Sub Training on January 23rd. If you are interested in becoming a Sub for the district, this is a required training. Contact Admin with any questions.

Teacher's Corner

I have found that teaching is a never-ending profession. As educators, we never should stop learning, to do so, could lead to stagnation and drops in grade and knowledge. I constantly look for ways to improve my lessons, this is very useful as I have found several means to get the same knowledge across and generally allows for better student retention of knowledge. Marzano has 9 Strategies we can use to help our students achieve.

Identifying Similarities and Differences: helps students understand more complex problems by analyzing them in a simpler way.

Summarizing and Note-taking: promotes comprehension because students have to analyze what is important and what is not important and put it in their own words .

Reinforcing Effort and Providing Recognition: showing the connection between effort and achievement helps students helps them see the importance of effort and allows them to change their beliefs to emphasize it more.

Homework and Practice: provides opportunities to extend learning outside the classroom, but should be assigned based on relevant grade level. All homework should have a purpose and that purpose should be readily evident to the students.

Nonlinguistic Representations: has recently been proven to stimulate and increase brain activity.

Cooperative Learning: has been proven to have a positive impact on overall learning.

Setting Objectives and Providing Feedback: provide students with a direction. Objectives should not be too specific and should be adaptable to students' individual objectives.

Generating and Testing Hypotheses: it's not just for science class! Research shows that a deductive approach works best, but both inductive and deductive reasoning can help students understand and relate to the material.

Cues, Questions, and Advanced Organizers: helps students use what they already know to enhance what they are about to learn. These are usually most effective when used before a specific lesson.

We all should give these more thought, I know I have and I am seeing improvement.
