For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Jefferson Middle School Has not been given one of these labels.

During the 2016-2017 school year, the students of Jefferson Middle School have demonstrated progress in achievement on the MSTEP, NWEA, and SAT assessments. We appreciate the continued support from the parents, staff, and our community in this effort. During the fall of 2016, approximately 58% of JMS parents and guardians attended conferences. Students are assigned to Jefferson Middle School if they reside in the Lakeview Public Schools' boundaries. Students may also attend through the Schools of Choice opportunity. All students must meet the academic criteria for placement in 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, or 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Schools of Choice students must live in Macomb County, have an incident free two year discipline record, and apply within the Schools of Choice application window. Jefferson Middle School staff members and the Building School Improvement Committee finalized our School Improvement Plan during the 08-09 school year. 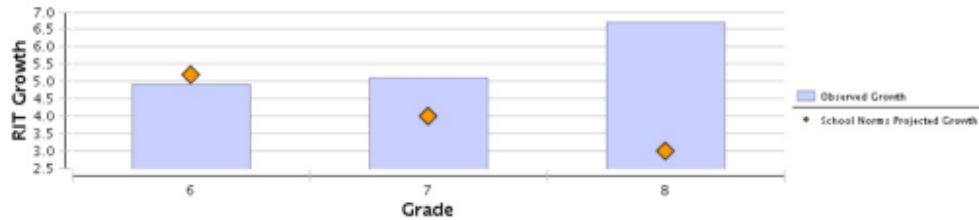

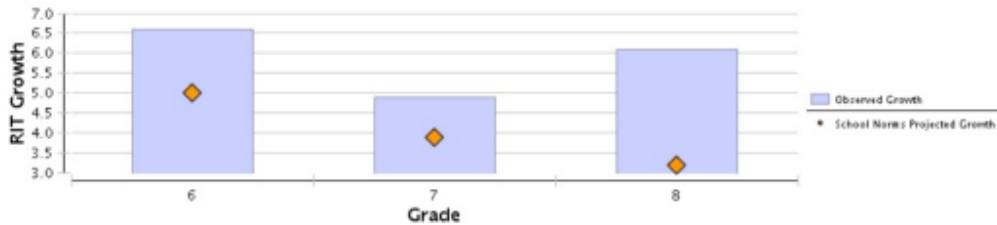

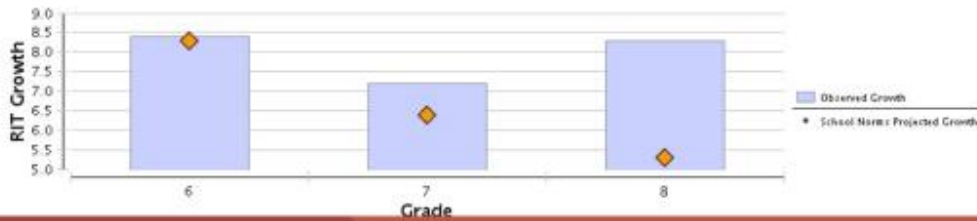
