Parents of Hubbard High School Seniors:

Your final year of high school has arrived! We hope it is a successful one and that we see you walk across the stage to receive your diploma come June.

But before that eventful night, there is a full year of course work, college essays and applications, the possible retake of the SAT or ACT, extracurricular activities and, of course, the senior year activities: (senior luncheon, prom).

To make it to that stage, seniors need to have

- earned the appropriate 24 credits,
- passed consumer's education,
- Passed driver's education,
- Passed the U.S. Constitution exam,
- taken the SAT on a state school day testing date. (April 10, 2018 or an approved makeup day)
- completed 40 hours of service learning (should be completed by the end of semester 1)
- submitted all medical compliance documents (**You must be in medical compliance to attend the Homecoming Dance**),
- paid off all school debts.

For seniors who need to recover credits, you must sign up for evening school and earn a passing grade(s) in the class(es). Waiting for summer school will delay your graduation until August 2019.

All seniors must **maintain a 95% attendance rate in order to participate in Homecoming, Senior Luncheon, Great America Grad Night, and Prom.** Every day of school is important; so be present each day.

Tardies will also count negatively towards your attendance rate. Be on time to school and each period, every day!

If you meet all of the high school graduation requirements, but do not meet the attendance, tardy or discipline requirements, you will have some of your graduation tickets revoked.
