## Greeneville Parks & Recreation Coaches' Code of Conduct

### Commitment to the players:

1. Coaches will put the welfare of their team members above all else while maintaining an appropriate relationship with them.
2. Coaches shall encourage the participants to exhibit good sportsmanship at all times.
3. All games will be conducted within the letter and intent of the rules of the sport.
4. Coaches shall remember that their players are student-athletes and shall not make unreasonable demands upon them that will be detrimental to their academic goals or that compromise their academic pursuits.
5. Coaches shall follow the organization and national governing body rules, state, and local laws regarding drug, alcohol, and tobacco use.
6. Coaches should do their best to involve every player in games and practices equally.
7. Coaches will use positive instruction methods and refrain from any action that would be demeaning or humiliating to the player.
8. Coaches will always keep in mind that the players are in the process of learning the sport and that mistakes are a natural part of the learning process.

### Commitment to the program:

1. Coaches will behave in a manner that will bring credit to the program, team members, and to themselves.
2. Coaches will exhibit professionalism in their actions, words, and attire.

### Commitment to other coaches:

1. A coach has an obligation to be honest and forthright with other coaches in the program.
2. Coaches will treat their colleagues with dignity and respect. Profanity and derogatory behavior is not acceptable.
3. No coach will be allowed to make derogatory remarks about other coaches, opposing players, officials, spectators, or the program in general.

### Commitment to the officials:

1. All game officials shall be treated in a professional and respectable manner at all times.
2. Any disagreement with an official's actions or conduct shall be addressed through the proper channels and not through public opinion or demonstration.
3. All coaches should strive to develop positive working relations with the officials.
4. Coaches must refrain from making derogatory remarks about the officials. This is not the example that we wish to set for our children.

**\*\*\* Any player, coach, or fan who curses or threatens an official, scorekeeper, opposing coach, player, league official, fan, or employee of the Greeneville Parks & Recreation Department will be suspended for at least two (2) games. This suspension may result in a more harsh penalty, which will be determined by the Recreation Office in conjunction with the Advisory Board of the Parks & Recreation Department. Any person who touches, pushes, strikes, or threatens an official, scorekeeper, opposing coach, player, league official, fan, or employee of the Greeneville Parks & Recreation Department will be suspended from the program for at least one (1) year and possibly for life. This one year suspension will be from calendar year to calendar year. (For example: If you are given a one year suspension on November 24, 2015, you will be suspended through November 24, 2016.) If a suspension is given to a coach, player, or fan, that particular person will be barred and not allowed to attend any recreation game at any recreation venue for the duration of their suspension. This means that you will not be allowed at any game that is being played at any field or in the vicinity of any Greeneville Parks & Recreation facility where games are being played. Failure to abide by this rule will result in a much more severe penalty. Once a suspension has been handed down, the offender will learn of the start and end dates of said suspension in a letter that he/she will receive from the Greeneville Parks & Recreation Department.**

\*\*Upon signing this form, I agree to follow the coaches' code of conduct and understand fully that my coaching privileges may be revoked at any time by the Greeneville Parks & Recreation Department for reasons that are deemed in the best interest of the department and the children that I serve.
