

Rancho Vista Fall Student Council Election Information 2018/19

- Applications are available September 14-19th in the office or library
- Applications and speeches are due to the Principal by September 21, 2018
- Candidates must schedule a speech rehearsal September 26/27
- Candidates will give their speech at a school assembly after lunch on Friday, September 28th
- The election will immediately follow the assembly on Friday, September 28th
- Election results will be announced at the end of the day on Friday, September 28th

Student Council Offices

President (5th only)

- Leads Meeting
- Sets the agenda after discussing the ideas with the advisors
- Monitors the responsibilities of other officers
- Writes articles for the banner

Vice President (4th or 5th only)

- Leads meetings in the absence of the president
- Works on all student council activities
- In charge of posting and removing all student council signs

Secretary (4th or 5th)

- Takes notes at each meeting and reads the previous meeting minutes at student council meetings
- Keeps track of representative and officer attendance

Treasurer (4th or 5th)

- Responsible for keeping records of all expenditures and income
- Oversees counting money before and after each fundraising event

Student Council Meetings will be held TWO Thursdays a month from 12:30-1:00p.m., please note that this is AT LUNCH. Student Council meetings are mandatory for elected officers.

Campaigning

- Each candidate will use the "Student Council Speech Tips Worksheet" to write a campaign speech.
- Candidates may not make any campaign promises as student council events/fundraisers are subject to approval by the principal and teacher advisors.
- Candidates may make on 18" X 24" (or smaller) poster. No other signage is allowed
