**SCHOOL DESCRIPTION**

Robert M. Beren Academy is a Jewish co-educational Pre-K through 12 grade college preparatory school with an enrollment of 330. Fifty-five students are enrolled in the High School (grades 9-12). Beren Academy is dedicated to preparing students for success in college and beyond and developing in students a mature appreciation of their Jewish heritage. Each student pursues a program of secular studies, Judaic studies, enrichment courses, and extracurricular activities.

Accreditations and affiliations include the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools/AdvancED, Yeshiva University Institute for University-School Partnership, the National Honor Society, the Jewish Federation of Greater Houston, the College Board, ACT, and the Texas and National Association for College Admission Counseling.

Robert M. Beren Academy, located on a 52-acre campus in the southwest area of Houston, Texas, was founded in 1969 as The South Texas Hebrew Academy. The state-of-the-art facility includes chemistry, biology, physics, and computer technology laboratories; a 10,000-volume library, including a major Judaic collection, a regulation-size gymnasium, and art room. In addition, there are large athletic fields for physical education classes and interscholastic athletic competition.

**PROGRAM OF STUDY**

Students attending Robert M. Beren Academy pursue an intensive dual curriculum of secular and Judaic studies. The secular studies enumerated in the school profile conform to the highest national standards for college preparation. The Judaic studies program consists of a sequential series of core courses, including intense study of Bible and Jewish Law and Philosophy. The combination of the two areas of study creates an atmosphere of academic excellence, which demands higher critical and analytical skills.

**ADMISSIONS AND FACULTY/STAFF**

Admission to Robert M. Beren Academy is selective and based upon the applicant's achievement record, testing, recommendations, and interviews.

The Academy's high school academic administrative staff includes the Head of School, the Principal of General Studies, and the Principal of Judaic Studies. The high school faculty and administration consists of 23 men and women, 17 of whom hold an advanced degree.

**GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

- 4 years each of English, Math, History, and Science
- 4 years of 3-4 Judaic subjects (Bible, Talmud, Jewish Philosophy, and/or Jewish Law)
- 3 years of Modern Hebrew Language
- 4 years of Electives (including Foreign Languages other than Hebrew)
- 25 hours of Community Service per year



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**GRADING POLICY AND RANK**

Robert M. Beren Academy does not rank students. Student grades are assessed on a 100-point numeric scale. Transcript grades in Advanced Placement, Pre-AP, Advanced, and Honors classes reflect a weighting of five percentage points and one point on the Grade Point Average. The Academy reports student Grade Point Average on a weighted 4-point scale. The highest GPA for the 2017-2018 school year is 4.7843.
