EXTRA INFORMATION ABOUT MATH AND SCIENCE SEQUENCES:

- Typical math sequence is Algebra > Geometry > Algebra II > Trig/Math Analysis > AP Calculus AB > AP Calculus BC
- Accelerated students take:
Alg II/Trig Honors > Math An/Calc Honors (3 years of math in those 2 years) > AP Calculus BC
- All students must take Biology or Bio Honors and Chemistry or Chemistry Honors before taking an AP or IB science course. As a result, the maximum number of AP or IB science courses a student can take is almost always two.

Diamond Bar High School, founded in 1982, is a four-year public high school. DBHS is accredited by WASC and located in the city of Diamond Bar, California, 35 miles east of Los Angeles. There are over 125 teachers on campus in addition to over 50 support staff members. In addition to our regular academic programs, our students have available to them the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program, an extensive Advanced Placement Curriculum, and three Academies which allow them to pursue specialized interests. The three academies are: Pathways Communications Academy, Performing Arts Academy and the Brahma Technology Academy.

The Administrative structure at DBHS consists of one Principal, one Assistant Principal, four Instructional Deans, eight Grade Level Coordinators, one Intervention Counselor, a School Psychologist, an Operations Manager, Activities Director, Athletic Director and Directors of our Pathways Communications Academy, Performing Arts Academy and Brahma Technology Academy.

Job Description

DBHS has eight Grade Level Coordinators. Two Grade Level Coordinators, GLCs, work with each grade level. A GLC will start with 9th graders and stay with the class through graduation from high school. The GLC's role includes academic advisor, college guidance counselor, attendance counselor, and disciplinarian. The GLC is responsible for the whole child and will be the main contact for students and parents during the student's high school experience. GLC's interact with students during the entire school day including all school events during and after school. The GLC will conduct mandatory annual meetings with the student and the student's parents during the summer. The student's academic plan and performance are reviewed including college plans, graduation progress, behavior, and social and emotional development. Caseloads range from 350 – 400 per GLC. DBHS is a very academically competitive campus with highly motivated students. As a result, senior GLC's will write 150-200 letters of recommendation during senior year.
